

The country is facing an invasion. An invasion of bed bugs. The blood sucking insects are back in Paris and in other cities. Bed bugs were supposed to have been killed off in the 1950s but they're back with a vengeance in hotels, in trains and cinema halls. The little creatures have been popping up everywhere. Apparently French authorities are alarmed. They're trying to address this outbreak on a war footing. Emergency meetings are being held all over France. But the question is, Is this really a new phenomenon or has it become a big deal for different reasons? After all the Olympic games are coming to Paris next year and no country wants players to win bed bug bites instead of medals. Sofas, cushions, high speed trains, bed bugs seem to be everywhere like a scourge that has descended upon France. The French media is in a frenzy. They're pushing out one **doomsday** headline after the other and the people are panicking. This panic has spread to the lawmakers. The French Transportation Minister is holding meetings with transport operators. He says he wants to reassure and protect the public. The Paris city council is on high alert. A part of this panic revolves around the upcoming Paris Olympics next year. Tens of thousands of visitors are expected to come to Paris. They'll be put up in hotels around the city. Some will inevitably travel around the rest of France and the French people don't want their guests taking home bad memories and a bug infestation. Even though travelers may be part of the problem, the first reports of bed bug **infestations** are coming from

the big hotels, the Palaces, the five star hotels where there are no hygiene problems that's for sure. It's people who have traveled and brought back bed bugs and left them in the hotel. France was supposed to have gotten rid of bed bugs in the 1950s but people traveling to other parts of the world seem to have brought some back. Bed bugs can get into your luggage. They can make an overseas journey in your suitcase and then multiply once you get back home. But it's not just the foreign bugs that are infesting France. They have some tough homegrown varieties as well. After World War II, powerful insecticides like DDT was sprayed all over Europe. These did kill a lot of bed bugs but not all of them. Some insecticide resistant bugs survived and the ones you see today are their descendants making today's bugs very hard to kill. For years now bed bug numbers have been on the rise in France. Between 2017 and 2022, 11% of French homes had been infested. This is according to France's national health and sanitary body. They've been tracking this bedbug crisis for years. In fact in 2020, France even launched a bed bug information hotline to counter the menace. So why the sudden panic then? A bit media hype and social media videos are leading to the new wave of panic. There's no sudden invasion or infestation. It's a problem that's been decades in the making but that doesn't mean the new attention is unwelcome. Bed bugs may be relatively harmless but they are still pests. This new panic wave could finally lead to the bed bugs taking a long dirt nap AKA death.
