- The luxury designer Outlet was **accused** of selling fake Cosette sells designer handbags at discounted prices, but some customers claim they were sold **rip-offs**.
- If you're looking for a bag designer, you must have the **privilege** that it comes with a **hefty** price tag, but there are ways to get discounted luxury goods. A call set in Sydney's CBD claims to sell authentic **cut-priced** couture, but some devastated customers believe the real bags they bought are actually fakes.
- O1:04 Erin wanted to treat herself after giving birth to her first child by being strong and making it. Though Aaron had never bought a real designer handbag before, when she found Cosette's website, the prices seemed like a **bargain**. They're selling discounted luxury items, which she knows isn't a common thing. She decided to get a Gucci handbag. She had gone back to the Gucci website and put both side by side to compare to make sure that they were**legitimate** items.

- The Cosette website has **authenticity** guaranteed on the front page. Aaron paid \$1,541.00 and was shocked to finally **flaunt** a real designer piece, but when her bag arrived, she had concerns. The dust bag usually thinks that was probably the main **giveaway**; it doesn't say that it was made in Italy, which she knows a lot of them do.
- A few months ago, that **bubble burst** when her friend Milana paid \$1,767.60 for a Prada bag from Cosette. When she did receive the bag, it was very **evident**, based on my personal opinion, that it was not the real deal. Milana is a fashion stylist and owns several luxury pieces. She bought a designer bag from Cosette before and had no issue, but she felt something wasn't right. There was an order that was very **odd**. It was a factory smell, and then the main logo on the bag on the outside was **crooked**. Milana didn't bother getting the bag **re-authenticated** to find out whether her **suspicion** was correct; she just wanted a **refund**, which she received. Milana posted on social media, warning others, leading Aaron to question the **authenticity** of her Gucci.
- Another mom, Louise, paid \$2,415 for a wire cell bag from Cosette, which arrived with a certificate of authenticity from **reputable** authenticators. Louise actually noticed that the photos on the certificate sort of looked a bit different than my actual bag. A few hours later, Louise received a response from the authenticators: the bag is fake. Louise, like the others, received a full refund but wants people to be aware of what happened to her. When they **confronted** Cosette's staff, they maintained everything was **above board**.
- In a statement, Cosette **denied** selling fakes; all goods sold at the set price are **genuine**. Cosette **conducts** quality control and authenticates goods independently by third parties. Any claims that we sell fake bags or that these refunds imply that we have admitted that we sell fake bags are false. The national fashion editor for the Sydney Morning Herald, Melissa Singer, was **tipped off** about the **allegations**, and after a month-long investigation, the story broke. If these allegations are true, the obvious benefit to cost is that they are selling goods at a heavily **inflated** margin; they're selling bags that maybe only cost them a fraction of the price that they are selling them for. A current **affair** is not to suggest that Cosette **deliberately** sold fakes to customers. Authenticator Jane Thompson from Blue Spinach says **counterfeit** products are becoming increasingly hard to detect. 06:23
